





Founding of the Abbeville Rotary Club

The seed responsible for the birth of the Rotary Club of Abbeville was planted back in 1929 when our neighbors in New Iberia became imbued with the missionary spirit and first approached a number of citizens of Abbeville in an effort to comply with the Rotary mandate to organize new clubs. The Abbeville club was born in the fall of 1936, and was sponsored by the New Iberia club.

Felix J. Samson, a local attorney, became the Club's founder and headed the efforts to form a Rotary Club in Abbeville, a small town of only 3,600.

On Wednesday evening, November 4, 1936, 26 men met at the Audrey Hotel Restaurant to sign the Rotary International charter application. The following is the list of the twenty-six CHARTER members, as they were submitted on the application:

Mr. Lege (Pat) was President of the First National Bank
for many years. Served as Secretary for first two years.



THOMAS J. FLEMING, JR. Railroad Transportation Mr. Fleming was agent of the office of Southern Pacific Railroad (also known as the Texas & New Orleans Railroad here in Abbeville). He also served on the City Council for many years.



A.O. LANDRY Hardware Retailing A.O. was in the real estate business and founder of Landry's Store.



DR. A. A. COMEAUX Hospitals Dr. Comeaux was a medical doctor, serving this area for many years. He donated the property for the city park which bears his name.



H. FRENZEL PERE' Refined Oil Product Retailing In 1936, he owned a service station and the Plymouth car dealership, Frenzel Motors. He was the grandfather of Lloyd Dore' III.



FLOYD D. EDWARDS Newspaper Publishing Floyd was owner of the Abbeville Meridional newspaper and ran a printing business.



FRANK A. GODCHAUX, JR. Rice Milling Frank, Jr., was the chief executive of the La. State Rice Milling Company.



E. N. KIRKPATRICK Rice Exporting Mr. Kirk was sales manager of the La. State Rice Milling Company.



LLOYD P. BROUSSARD Automobile Retailing Lloyd was associated with the Nettles Chevrolet firm, a car dealership. He also served as this area's LA state representative.

The Abbeville Charter is dated November 18, 1936 and was presented by District 17 Governor James M. "Ty" Cobb on December 8, 1936 at an evening meeting held at the Audrey Hotel. The Club was incorporated under the laws of the State of Louisiana on August 22, 1963. Abbeville became the 4057th Rotary Club chartered in the world of Rotary International.

By June 30, 1937 there were 4335 Rotary clubs with 183,000 Rotarians throughout the world. Since that time Rotary has grown to include over 1.2 million Rotarians belonging to over 32,000 Rotary clubs in more than 200 countries and geographical areas (September 2011).

Although we are presently in Rotary District 620, our Club was chartered in District 17. Areas have been reorganized through the years with our Club being in District 17 from 1936-1937, District 139 from 1937-1949, District 202 from 1949-1957, District 619 from 1957-1958, and in our present District 620 from 1958 to present (designated as District 6200 in 1991).

During the past 75 years the Abbeville Rotary Club has held its regular luncheon meetings at several locations. Ben Boudreaux's Bar & Diner was our first meeting place from 1936 to 1940; presently the sight of Dupuy's Oyster Bar. From 1940 to 1951 we met at the Catholic Community Center, now the sight of the St. Mary Magdalen Ministries Building. In 1951 we briefly met at the Old American Legion Hall, until we moved to Harry Bohrer's Midway where we met from 1951 to 1958, on the corner of Concord & Jefferson, downtown.

In 1958 we moved across the street to the second floor of the Bank of Abbeville. known then as the Candlelight Annex. From 1961 until 1962 we met at Moore's Restaurant, located on Charity Street, presently the location across from the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's office annex. In 1962 to the present day, the Abbeville Rotary Club has held its weekly lunch meetings at the Abbeville Country Club.

Members of the club have shown interest in district and international functions. Many members have attended international conventions in the United States. Several members have attended Rotary meetings while traveling in France, Europe, Mexico and Canada.

Our Club has furnished three district governors and one Rotary International Director.

Our Club sponsored the Rotary Club in near-by Kaplan, chartered June 2, 1972.

The Club realizes that attendance of members at Club meetings is stressed because Rotary started as a club to build friend ships; and that only by attending meetings can we share our friendships. Only by attending the meetings of other clubs can we get to know Rotarians outside our club.

Beginning with the Club's first program chairman, W.B. MacMillan, good programs have encouraged good attendance. We have heard from local, parish, and state officials, from leaders in the field of education, from scientists and from statewide business and industry organizations, U.S. Senators and Congressmen, FBI agents, and representatives of national interests. Among the best programs rendered were given by our own members when they talked about their business or professional lives.

FELIX J. SAMSON

The Abbeville Rotary Club's founder, Felix Joseph Samson, a widely known and successful lawyer and a recognized leader in the civic and public affairs of Abbeville for more than a third of a century, had been engaged in the practice of law here since 1905 and filled several positions of trust and responsibility. From 1908 until 1912 he was a member of the state legislature from Vermilion Parish district.

Mr. Samson was a member and trustee of the St. Mary Magdalen Catholic Church and was the first Grand Knight of the local lodge of the Knights of Columbus organized in 1921. He was a member of the board of directors of the Bank of Abbeville and Trust Company. He was city attorney for Abbeville for three terms, served as treasurer of the Vermilion chapter of the American Red Cross from the end of World War I until his death, and acted as chairman for the parish during the third War Bond drive during World War I. He was active in many Chamber of Commerce projects, and backed Boy Scout movements until his death.

Mr. Samson holds the distinction of being the only president of the Abbeville Rotary Club to serve two terms - 1936 to 1938. Felix J. Samson passed away on May 7, 1951 at the age of 69.

W. B. MACMILLAN

W. B. MacMillan was very instrumental in the Club's formation and in continuing its growth. Mr. Mac's commitment to Rotary and the ideals of Rotary were experienced by everyone he met. In our club he was given the unofficial title of "Mr. Rotary."

Mr. MacMillan was suitably honored when the Club raised \$1,000 and made him the first Paul Harris Fellow from the Abbeville Rotary Club in 1974.

W. B. MacMillan passed away on September 4, 1978 at the age of 94.



A LEGACY OF SERVICE

The Abbeville Rotary Club is fortunate to have been able to serve this community since 1936, initiating many projects involving the community and its youth. "Service Above Self" the Rotary motto, is a tradition of our Club.

The Abbeville Rotary Club and its individual members have been in the forefront of many civic enterprises.

In the early years, the Club was responsible for organizing and raising funds for many community service projects. The Club awarded a prize animal to an outstanding 4-H member. During World War II the Club spearheaded scrap collection and bond drives. In 1945 we began sponsorship of Boy Scout Troop 80, helping young men to grow to become responsible adults. In 1949, through the inspiration of President Edward LeBlanc, the "What I Want To Be and Why" essay contest, a project aimed at assisting high school students to determine what direction their lives will take, was started. Throughout the past seventy-five years the Abbeville Rotary Club has supported youth baseball teams, sponsored activities that benefit the aged, and organized projects that serve the whole community.

The Club and its individuals have a splendid record of civic work for Abbeville, a tradition begun with the founding of the Club. The Club has helped raise funds for several local needs, including setting up perpetual funds to support the following:

<u>Vermilion Special Olympics Fund</u>- Created June 1983 Current funds are \$33,000+

<u>Chester Broussard Vo-Tech Fund</u> / Created June 1989 Current funds are \$33,000+

What I Want To Be And Why Essay Contest Fund - Created April 1996 Current funds are \$28,000+

Norman Romero/Ronney Mayard Honor Band Fund – Created August 1998 Current funds are \$27,000+

Members of the Abbeville Rotary Club also serve on many fund raising committees in this area.

Abbeville Rotarians also support the programs of the Rotary Foundation, which annually awards scholarships for a year's study abroad, sponsors hundreds of cultural exchanges between countries and conducts several large-scale projects to improve health, alleviate hunger and promote cultural advancement in lesser-developed areas of the world. One notable project taken on by the Rotary Foundation is its pledge to immunize every human being in the world against polio.

Since the PolioPlus program was started in 1985 polio cases worldwide have fallen by 99%, more than 5 million children are walking who would have been paralyzed and more than 1.5 million lives have been saved with the progress that Rotary International has made in eradicating polio.
